(1) These shares are held jointly with spouse.

(2) The shares of common stock represent a portion of the reporting person's salary stock compensation. The shares are subject to restrictions on transfer for a period of two years from the date of issuance. For more information, please see the Current Report on Form 8-K filed by Enterprise Financial Services Corp on December 23, 2009.

(3) Withholding of stock to satisfy tax withholding obligation on issuance of salary stock.

(4) The reporting person holds units in the stock fund and the number of shares reported as indirectly held in the 401 (k) plan in this row is an estimate of the number of shares of the issuer's Common Stock held in the unitized stock fund and allocated to the reporting person's account.

(5) Effective 10/01/2004 the Board fully vested the outstanding employee and Director stock options.

(6) Options vest 33% per year for three years

(7) Each RSU represents the right to receive one share of Common Stock, subject to adjustment as provided in the Grant Agreement.

(8) The RSUs vest at a rate of 20% annually over five years, subject to continued employment of the reporting person. Vesting occurs on December 15 of each year, commencing in the calendar year of the grant. On each vesting date, for each RSU vesting on such date, the reporting person will receive one share of Common Stock.

(9) Each SSAR consists of the right to receive an amount, in common stock, equal to the excess of the fair market value of a share of common stock on the date of exercise over the exercise price of the SSAR. The SSARs vest at a rate of 20% annually over five years, subject to continued employment of the reporting person. Vesting occurs on December 15 of each year, commencing December 15, 2007.

(10) Each SSAR consists of the right to receive an amount, in common stock, equal to the excess of the fair market value of a share of common stock on the date of exercise over the exercise price of the SSAR. The SSARs vest at a rate of 20% annually over five years, subject to continued employment of the reporting person. Vesting occurs on December 15 of each year, commencing December 15, 2008.

(11) Each SSAR consists of the right to receive an amount, in common stock, equal to the excess of the fair market value of a share of common stock on the date of exercise over the exercise price of the SSAR. The SSARs vest at a rate of 33% annually over three years, subject to continued employment of the reporting person. Vesting occurs on September 24 of each year, commencing September 24, 2009.
