Item 7.01 Regulation FD Disclosure

On March 19, 2013, Fifth Third Bancorp (Fifth Third) issued a press release announcing (1) that it has declared a cash dividend on its common shares of \$0.11 for the first quarter of 2013 that is payable on Thursday, April 18, 2013 to shareholders of record as of Friday, March 29, 2013, (2) that its 2013 Comprehensive Capital Analysis & Review (CCAR) plan included the potential increase in the quarterly dividend to \$0.12 per share in the second quarter of 2013 through the first quarter of 2014, which will be considered by its Board of Directors at its next regularly scheduled Board meeting in June, and (3) that its Board of Directors approved a new share repurchase authorization of up to 100 million shares. A copy of this press release is attached as Exhibit 99.1 and is incorporated herein by reference.

The information in this Item 7.01 and the Exhibit attached hereto shall not be deemed filed for purposes of Section 18 of the Securities Act of 1934, nor shall it be deemed incorporated by reference in any filing under the Securities Act of 1933, except as shall be expressly set forth by specific reference.

Item 8.01 Other Events

On March 19, 2013, Fifth Third s Board of Directors authorized Fifth Third to repurchase up to 100 million shares of its outstanding common stock in the open market or in privately negotiated transactions, and to utilize any derivative or similar instrument to effect share repurchase transactions (including without limitation, accelerated share repurchase contracts, equity forward transactions, equity option transactions, equity swap transactions, cap transactions, collar transactions, floor transactions or other similar transactions or any combination of the foregoing transactions). This share repurchase authorization replaces the Board s previous authorization pursuant to which approximately 54 million shares remained available for repurchase by Fifth Third.
